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Hiking, Huron, History . . . and Lunch! Join RTOERO Sauble Falls Hike Save the Date - Thursday, September 7, 2023

(Rain date – Friday, September 8th)

Enjoy a late summer hike exploring the Sauble area. Kevin Fisher, an RTOERO member and a member of the Bruce Trail Association, will host a two-part, easy-to-moderate hike followed by a sandwich luncheon at Kevin's cottage, compliments of Bruce Grey Unit. The hike is designed to be inclusive – non-hikers, newbies and seasoned outdoor enthusiasts alike will enjoy this late summer outing. Maximum of 25 hikers.

Part One of the hike is short, roughly 30 minutes, and includes Sauble's spectacular beach, the point, the boardwalk and a walk along the roadside past some of the oldest cottages in the area. At this point, if you're tired or wish to explore on your own, you can leave and rejoin the group for the luncheon at noon.

Part Two of the hike, roughly 90 minutes, continues on to forest trails and the Sauble Falls Provincial Park. Kevin will provide historic and geographic information of the area. High points include descending stairs to a boardwalk along the Sauble River rapids to explore the historic ruins of Sauble Falls Mill as well as early businesses. There is a rest station at Sauble Falls Provincial Park.

If you wish to participate in the social only, take advantage of the free parking available after Labour Day at the public boat launch.

Please wear appropriate attire and footwear and bring water, sunscreen, bug spray and a lawn chair. Consider sunglasses, hiking poles, and any needed medications.

The masseur/masseuse in your hair salon may be renting space there, but unless he/she is an RMT, you may not receive a reimbursement of your expenditure. **How** will you know what services are available to you? The annual benefits booklet is available online at <u>rtoero.ca</u> : select "insurance" to view all benefits available to you. Don't have access to the internet? All members who are part of the RTOERO Health benefits programme would have received a hard copy of the Benefits booklet late last year.

The Bruce Grey Unit of RTOERO is pleased to support the annual Earth Film Festival. This year the Grey Sauble Conservation Foundation is hosting the film festival on Earth Day (April 20) and it is being held at the Roxy Theatre in Owen Sound.

The theme is climate study and penguins. A fabulous presentation from a local graduate student who became a marine biologist. Sarah McComb - Turbitt did her masters study on penguins in the Falkland Islands. In addition to her presentation, the film, *Antarctica from Above* will be featured. Sarah is a world class artist and she will connect her art work to her study on ocean mammals and birds.

Funds raised from this festival will be directed to conservation awards and local conservation projects. The Foundation is the supporter, providing funds to help complete conservation projects. The Foundation provides conservation awards to graduating students who demonstrate environmental ethics and they promote the Malcolm Kirk Scholarship Award, that students apply for, to be considered.

DISTRICT 10

Grants help our aging population.

The Board of Directors has recently approved the recommendation from the Foundation Peer Review Panel for six new grants for a total of \$213,000 that will be awarded in 2023.

• **Compassionate Communities Kingston Canada** is awarded \$43,000 for a project called "Community connectors": seniors helping seniors

• The Dementia Society of Ottawa and Renfrew County is awarded \$50,000 for its project; "Stronger together": making Canada dementia inclusive

• Sheridan College in Oakville will receive \$50,000 for an arts-based initiative called 'Using Visual Arts' to address social isolation in older adults

• The Canadian Organic Growers' project "Planting the Roots of Wellness" is awarded \$15,000

• Société Alzheimer Society Sudbury-Manitoulin North Bay is approved for a small \$5,000 project that they call "Friendship circle"

• **Trent University in Peterborough** will receive \$50,000 for its teaching initiative called "Ageism", intergenerational learning and age-conscious student development

The overarching goal of the annual grant program is to identify and partner with creative, results-based organizations in order to address the most critical issues faced by our aging population. The RTOERO

Foundation awards grants to projects that aim to improve seniors' health and wellness, promote social engagement for older adults and pursue innovative research in the field of geriatrics and gerontology.



The RTOERO Foundation will distribute more information about these grants to be shared with all members in the coming months.

In the province of Ontario political unrest did not start, but gained momentum after the 43% voter turnout in the last provincial election with only 18% voting for our current Premier.

In November, when CUPE and many others supported the increase for EAs, childcare workers and caretakers in schools, this disappointment created a new movement of people protesting the rights of the working class. This form of protest, called *Enough is Enough*, had begun in England and has taken root in the Canadian Labour Unions. Those protesting are fed up with the rising cost of living, wage cuts and freezes. There is lots of anger by workers towards the present provincial government for not accepting the court ruling to increase wages.

One of the effects of the ongoing affordable housing crisis in Canada is a growing number of young adults opting to live with their parents. According to the 2021 Census, there are 442000 multigenerational households in Canada. This is an increase of 50% since 2001. There are many family, health and educational benefits to this current living situation but in reality, will young people ever be able to afford their own homes?


RTOERO Foundation announces first silent auction

Know how a fraudster may approach you to protect yourself

It's not a fun topic to talk about, but one we shouldn't avoid-financial fraud and identity theft. The website GetSmarterAboutMoney.ca by the Ontario Securities Commission offers tips and advice to help you recognize fraud and protect yourself. Knowing how a fraudster may approach you is important. Here are some of the ways:

Emails or text messages - a fraudster may pose as someone trustworthy to try to get private information. They may also encourage you to open a link or attachment. If an email seems suspicious, delete it. Don't reply.

Social media – Scammers create fake accounts or take over another person's account. They may also try to form an online relationship with you. Delete connection requests from people you don't know. Review the privacy settings on your accounts.

Phone – Phone scammers may change their caller ID to appear legitimate. They may claim to be from a business or government agency. Avoid doing business over the phone unless you've made the call yourself. If you're not sure, hang up, then call the company back.
